- **Engages** with governments and private developers through participation and representation in relevant committees and studies via direct negotiation

How You Can Participate

- Overhead costs, including insurance cover, incorporation costs, advertising and printing

- Forum invitations
- Social events

In addition, WECA members give thousands of voluntary hours organizing and participating in events, stalls, forums, workshops and meetings, writing letters and preparing submissions, serving on committees, and networking between West End community groups.
